Head Start Program Management and Compliance Issues

With the implementation of the Road Map to Excellence, the revising of the Performance Standards, and the move toward re-competition, the need for programs to meet and exceed program compliance is greater than ever. In this session we will look at the results of Ohio on-site reviews for the past two years with the most frequently violated standards highlighted and explore how ongoing monitoring and self assessment might have preempted those violations. We will focus on the review protocol for 2011 and what changes- if any – will be made, and we will discuss the dynamics of an unannounced review. It has been announced that 10% of the programs in Ohio being reviewed in 2011 will have their review visit unannounced. All of this and more...

Movin' and Groovin' for Great Child Outcomes: A Session for Parents

Children learn through play and movement. This session, designed for Head Start parents, will help participants understand the child outcomes framework and how specific activities apply to each domain. As a result of this session, parents will not only have a better understanding of how teachers facilitate learning in the classroom, but also how they can extend this learning at home.

The AAPD Head Start Dental Home Initiative

AAPD Dental Home Initiative Leadership Team Members, including Jan Silverman, Head Start Dental Home Project Manager, and Dr. Jim Crall, Director of the National Oral Health Policy Center

The Head Start Dental Home Initiative links AAPD's expertise and organizational strengths with existing HS/EHS program resources (e.g., training and technical assistance programs, information resources, and regional oral health consultants). AAPD and the Office of Head Start believe that these strategic activities complement and supplement recent HS/EHS oral health efforts and supply a critical missing component — networks of dentists capable of providing quality dental homes that meet the full range of oral health needs for HS/EHS infants and children. This partnership will also provide parents, caregivers and HS staff with the latest evidence-based information on how they can help prevent tooth decay and establish a foundation for a lifetime of oral health. Participants will discuss current challenges and opportunities related to oral health services for Head Start children, and will learn about existing and developing resources to support the provision of services.

Healthy Habits Part 1: Healthy Activity

The importance of providing physical activity opportunities in child care settings will be stressed. Participants will demonstrate how to utilize the materials from the Healthy Children, Healthy Weights Toolbox to create a healthy environment. This session provides participants with structured and unstructured physical activity ideas. Participants will walk away with ideas on how to link Early Learning Content Standards to classroom activities while providing opportunities for physical activity.

This session is the first in a series of four sessions that will be offered at OHSAI meetings through this program year. Participants must attend all four sessions to receive SUTQ credit. These sessions are part of the requirement to apply for Ohio Healthy Program status. See enclosed flyer for more information.

Participating in Ohio's Healthy Programs

Childhood obesity has become a state and national concern. It is important that child care settings advocate healthy lifestyles and positive choices. **Ohio's Healthy Programs** project promotes health and wellness in child care settings through enrollment in this project. Child care programs which wish to participate will receive training on wellness and obesity prevention, technical assistance on the project if desired, sample policies and menus, nutrition materials, activity cards, a health and wellness toolkit and more!

Child care programs will be able to apply for Ohio's Healthy Program status by:

Application Steps	Application Requirements
Attending the SUTQ-approved training, Healthy Children, Healthy Weights now being offered statewide by Healthy Child Care Ohio as well as the child care resource and referral system	One staff person from each age level represented in the program must attend all of the parts of the Session 1 <i>HCHW training</i> . The administrator must attend the Healthy Policy training (Session 3) and if there is a staff cook they should attend the Healthy Menus training (Session 2).

Implementing a policy to ensure healthy practices are maintained in the program	Program policy will need to be submitted with the application. Attendance at the Healthy Policies session will assist administrators with creation of a program policy.
Demonstrating an improvement in menus for the children	Menus will need to show improvement by: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offering a different vegetable each day in a 5-day period • Offering a different fruit per day in a 5-day period (juice not counted) • Offering a whole grain food per day • Providing lower fat milk for classrooms with children 2 years of age and older
Including parents in the program such as providing bulletin boards, healthy articles in newsletters, cooking activities, meetings on the topic, etc.	Programs will need to submit at least one strategy for how parent participation for the project was achieved.

Who Can Apply?

Any program in Ohio serving young children including **centers** and **family child care** programs can apply. Status will be granted with the award of a framed certificate the first year with additional renewal options offered annually.

How Can My Program Apply?

An application process is available using the Ohio Professional Development Network Registry at www.OPDN.org. The four steps as outlined will be part of the application process. Programs applying for status will need to ensure the appropriate number of staff members have received training. If the training has been taken through the Registry, then actual documentation will not need to be taken. Administrators should be ready to upload their policies and improved menus at the time of application.

Technical assistance on the project will be available to programs after August, 2010.

Ohio's Healthy Programs Projects is managed by OCCRRA through funding provided by the Ohio Department of Health. *The *Healthy Children, Healthy Weights* curriculum is provided through a cooperative agreement with Columbus Public Health.
